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

iPads in Spanish

We are delighted that David Binns of Sanako UK has very generously given Mrs Stanley a free trial of Sanako Connect. David Binns visited us earlier this year to talk to students about the importance of languages. Now our year 10C Spanish students are the first to use Sanako Connect to revise for their speaking assessment. This technology allows students to listen to questions and seamlessly insert their own answers. They can also practise their reading and writing skills. Sanako Connect is a very powerful tool to aid students' learning of languages.

MVC Year 10 sport leaders did a fantastic job leading the activities and supporting the children throughout – making sure that they all had a really fun-packed afternoon.







English

Our Year 7 students have been studying persuasive writing over the past few weeks and have produced some wonderful leaflets. They don't just look great, they also demonstrate the excellent progress they have been making; showcasing their wide range of techniques and amazing persuasive writing skills.





Teaching and Learning

Following on from their work on embedding 'retrieval practice' techniques and tiers of language usage within the learning environment, teachers are now focusing on feedback. Feeding back to pupils is really important so they know how they are progressing with their work. Again, this is an area that staff will look at more closely over the coming weeks. We know pupils like to have their work marked, but this can be time consuming. Verbal, whole class and peer feedback are other ways that staff ensure pupils are able to see what they are doing well and what they need to do to improve.

Science

Science Club goes from strength to strength hot on the heels of receiving the bronze STEM Club Quality Mark. The students have had an 'eggcellent' time over the last few weeks creating NASA inspired egg landers. They initially created landers from junk materials and tested them by dropping eggs from various heights. The most successful even managed to protect their eggs from being thrown 5 metres up into the air! We therefore had to make a harder challenge the following week and only provided straws to protect their eggs with. Nevertheless, the students rose to the challenge and made some cracking landers, quite literally!

This week the students got to the 'heart' of science by watching Miss Piper dissect a sheep's lung before Miss Piper and Dr Johnson went on to dissect – yes you've got it – a heart! The students then had a chance to look at the anatomy of organs close up and see how everything is connected and how they work. Next week students will get the chance to dissect some eyeballs. Hopefully they will produce some eye-catching dissections!



St Andrew's Day – 30th November





















Student wellbeing
