Dear Parents and carers.

Well, here we are – about to enter the last week of the longest term of the school year. Everybody is getting tired, and we are noticing this in the increased lateness of pupils to school.

We have a coherent programme of personal development, much of which is delivered through tutor times and promptness to school is vital for all pupils. Please encourage and enable your child to be in school before 8.30am to ensure they receive the full entitlement of this important programme. In the New Year, we will be giving lunchtime detentions to any child arriving after the 8.30am bell has rung, so developing the habit of good punctuality will be really helpful.

Related to this, we have noticed some pupils who arrive to school on the bus, are then leaving the school site to walk into the village and visit the shop. Please can you ensure that your child understands this is not permitted, and will also incur a detention.

After Christmas, we will be starting the Mandarin Excellence Programme (MEP) in year 7. This entails creating a teaching group containing all MEP pupils and so the other teaching groups (the class in which pupils receive all lessons except maths, science and PE) will also be re-assembled. For many children, this will mean a change of teaching group in January and we are taking the opportunity to revisit maths and science groupings at the same time to ensure that all classes are taught by a subject expert. We will re-issue all year 7 pupils with new paper timetables on the first day of term, but their timetables will be visible on Bromcom and Go4Schools the weekend before the term starts.

#### VISIT FROM PROFESSOR PO-SHEN LOH





We were delighted to welcome Professor Po-Shen to MVC on Wednesday as a treat for our Year 10 pupils who enjoyed a fun and engaging maths lesson covering:



infinity, gemotric series, solving quadratic equations using a new method, and why we can't divide by zero.

#### After the lesson pupils said:

Professor Po was a very influential teacher who made an immense impression when he taught my maths class. His teaching style was unique. It was a fast-paced lesson yet it made logical sense. Instead of coming with a topic to teach he asked students for a topic and improvised a lesson to teach from our suggestions. Our class chose the subject of Quadratic equations and Prof Po taught us with his own technique to solve these equations with simple and logical steps. He told us instead of "un multiplying" the x term just simply unadd the C term. This method has helped me loads." Max

"Prof Po was not only a great teacher but also a general great guy when he came in to teach my class. He was very smart and explained in a very clear way, that I was able to understand and I learnt a huge amount in his lesson. He was talking about really interesting things to do with maths and now I am understanding more and am pursuing further to see what I can find out about maths." Archie

Professor Po-Shen is an American mathematician specializing in combinatorics (the study of discrete systems). He teaches at Carnegie Mellon University, and from 2014 to 2023 served as the national coach of the United States' International Mathematical Olympiad team. He is the founder of educational websites Expii and Live.
