MY CHILD AT SCHOOL

MCAS is available as a website on a laptop, PC or tablet, and as an app for phones and tablets, available from all app stores.

If you have not, you can link yourself in the app or website using the school's ID number or postcode (14767, SG8 6EF) and the email address we hold for you. We have allowed access for anyone listed as contact 1 or 2 on the school system – if you have any difficulties linking in MCAS, please email <u>MEL-DataManager@melbournvc.org</u> to ask for assistance.
