YEAR 7 REPORTS

At the end of term you will be receiving a report for your child, detailing their attitude in lessons and their assessment results in each subject.

In the meantime you may start seeing assessment data being put onto Go4Schools. For most subjects this will be expressed as the percentage that your child achieved in that assessment.

We are in the process of standardising assessments across subjects, but an age-expected average would be in the range of 50-60%.

Some subjects also report on skills tested in their subjects, and these may be expressed with terms such as 'emerging, expected or exceeding'.

For more specific information on a particular subject or assessment it is best to contact the head of department or class teacher.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

We have high standards for the behaviour of our pupils. Last week we told you all about 'How we teach' which included details of some of the things that pupils are expected to do in class. When a pupil fails to meet our expectations, and disrupts the learning in a class, we have a simple system that has 3 steps:



If a pupil is removed, they will be taken to the Removal Room for the remainder of that lesson, and will receive a sanction for the behaviour.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

At the recent parent event a question was raised about how much cover any one child will experience in a day. We said that we would benchmark our cover against other Trusts schools, and the data is back.

For the first half term of this year our pupils experienced the second lowest number of cover lessons in all Trust secondary schools, by a significant margin.

While this is good, we will not be complacent – we will continue to work to reduce the number of cover lessons, and to increase the quality of any cover lessons that do occur.

MY CHILD AT SCHOOL APP

You will have seen information that we emailed out about the new 'My Child At School' (MCAS) App. This app can tell you about your child's attendance and behaviour.

MCAS is available as a website on a laptop, PC or tablet, and as an app for phones and tablets, from all app stores.

A reminder that you will have received an email inviting you to link with your child's account. If you have not, you can link yourself in the app or website using the school's ID number or postcode (14767, SG8 6EF) and the email address we hold for you.

We have allowed access for anyone listed as contact 1 or 2 on the school system – if you have any difficulties linking in MCAS, please email MEL-DataManager@melbournvc.org to ask for assistance.

MCAS will show you a live version of your child's timetable so you will be able to see if your child is late arriving to a lesson as well as being able to see if the lesson is being taken by a supply teacher.



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YEAR 11 HISTORY REVISION BOOKS

The History Department recommends the Oxford Revise Edexcel GCSE History set of revision books for all KS4 History students. These can be used in class and at home. They contain excellent short summaries of each topic as well as exam tips, questions, answers and timelines. Many students have found these extremely useful.

In addition the Melbourn Village College Sharepoint contains a wealth of instructional videos, work sheets, past exam papers and markschemes that we encourage students and parents to explore and make use of in the run up to exams.









MVC CHRISTMAS LUNCH

On Wednesday 18th December we will be offering Christmas lunch for £2.50. This meal must be paid for in advance via ParentPay. If your child requires the vegetarian option, please let us know via this form by Friday 6th December. If we are not notified, pupils will receive the meat option by default. Please note that Wednesday 18th there will be no other food available at break, and no alternative meal at lunch time. Only drinks will be on sale at break time. Students must either pay for Christmas lunch on ParentPay in advance to receive the festive meal, or they can bring in a packed lunch.

If your child is in receipt of free school meals (FSM) they will automatically be provided with a Christmas lunch, but please complete this <u>form</u> if they require the vegetarian option.

BEHAVIOUR SYSTEM UPDATE

We wanted to share with you a key change to our behaviour system. This half term we have moved to a slightly different system. The same system of two reminders and then being removed from the lesson continues but we introduced а new behaviour where room. pupils will be taken to reflect on their behaviour. This new change will limit disruption to other pupils who are learning.

We are happy to report that in the first week, we have seen a 20% reduction in removals from lessons. We will continue to monitor this closely over the coming weeks.
