
YEAR 11 GCSE COOKING EXAM WEEK 2

She also undertook a radiology qualification to take X-rays, so she also has an understanding of physics. As a dental nurse, she has worked in a clinic, hospitals and a prison, and also in schools as an educator about dental health.

After a career break, she joined Melbourn Village College as an administration assistant and first aider on reception, and has enjoyed getting to know all students and staff in the school. However, she saw the science technician opportunity as a chance to use her scientific skills and knowledge, so was happy to join the science team.
