YOU SAID: WE DID

During the parent sessions I was asked about 'Progress 8' and what this means to parents. Progress 8 is a government measure used in secondary schools in England to track the progress students make between the end of primary school and the end of Year 11 in their best 8 GCSE subjects, comparing actual GCSE results to expected results based on their SATs at Primary School. 'Attainment 8' is the attainment of the best 8 GCSE grades for students. As our current Year 11 and 10 students did not sit their SATs at Primary School, the CAT 4 assessment scores from Year 7 have been used as our KS2 data to benchmark our target grades for students. As a result the main focus of performance tables for schools will be Attainment 8 and outcomes in English and Maths. We recognise our outcomes from previous years are below expected and we are continuing to drive up outcomes for students; Mr Luxton is working incredibly hard on our 'Raising Achievement' programme for Year 10 and 11 to ensure that we continue to drive outcomes for students.

MOBILE PHONES

Our current policy on mobile phones is that phones should be out of sight when on site. However, we are increasingly concerned about students using mobile phones during the school day and this is creating a distraction to their learning. We have a duty to create an environment that is calm, safe and free from distraction so all pupils, whatever their background, can learn and thrive. CAREERS ASSEMBLIES

Year 11 and year 8 pupils received a careers related assembly this week. For year 11s we will be offering further independent careers advice to them over the coming weeks to ensure they are secure with their post 16 options choices and future plans. This compliments the guidance they have had through mock interviews, college taster days and work experience in year 10, along with post 16 guidance, an apprenticeship event and a talk from a local Head of Sixth Form. Year 8s had an assembly about the importance of hard and soft skills, with the latter being something they practice everyday in their choices and interactions with others!

DISCOVERING CODE IN COMPUTER SCIENCE



Think of computer science lessons and you probably imagine a class of students sat in front of screens. However, in a change of pace, Mr Richardson's Year 8 pupils found themselves out on the field this week. They were challenged to send messages using Morse Code – or a code they devised themselves – using a variety of methods including drums, bells and coloured paper.

Mr Richardson said "This hands-on experience not only made learning fun but also provided valuable insights into the complexities of encoding information. It's crucial for students to understand why we use specific symbols to represent data. Next lesson, we'll dive into the fascinating world of binary numbers and explore how computers store and represent information."


YEAR 10 PATH TO SUCCESS PARENT EVENT




MVC SCHOOL POST



Please do always scroll down as there may be multiple messages. If you think you might have missed an email you can check your SchoolPost mailbox via the instructions below:

Accessing your SchoolPost Mailbox

- Click on 'MVC SchoolPost mailbox' in Quick Links at the bottom of any SchoolPost email you have received.
- · Use your email address and password to log in
- For first time users, please request password reset to set up your password.
- If the reset email does not come through, please check your spam/junk folder.



- Once in your mailbox, you will be able to access any communication sent from SchoolPost to the email address we hold for you in school.
- The default view for your mailbox will be the current academic year and the current month.
- · Use the mailbox overview to search for older emails.
